ITEMS THAT CAN BE RECYCLED AT THE DROP-OFF SITES

Aluminum Food Containers

Only food or beverage containers

Examples: soda cans and beer cans



Metal Cans (tin)

Food or beverage containers only, including metal caps or lids

Examples: Tuna cans, soup cans, and vegetable cans.



Before recycling metal cans you should

- 1.) Rinse all remains out of the can
- 2.) Crush the can to reduce the amount of space an empty can occupies in the recycling bin.



Plastic

All plastics with a spout (anything with a smaller opening than the bottle)

Examples: Such as laundry detergent bottles, water bottles, soda bottles, shampoo bottles.

NO butter tubs, yogurt containers, etc.

Before recycling plastic bottles you should

- 1.) **Remove the cap**
- 2.) **Empty contents and rinse.**
- 3.) **You don't need to remove labels.**
- 4.) **Crush plastic bottles by carefully stepping on them so they take up less room in the recycling container.**
- 5.) **Recap the flattened empty bottle and place it in the recycling container.**

Corrugated Cardboard

(Corrugated has ridges and furrows)
Remove wax liners and all other debris and flatten



Mixed paper

This includes junk mail, office paper, magazines, catalogs, paper board, phonebooks, and envelopes.

Clean and dry only

Remove plastic wrap on phone books and magazines.

Examples: cereal and tissue boxes, books (hardback and paperback), paper grocery sacks, toilet paper and paper towel rolls, pop cases, construction paper, envelopes with windows, etc.



Newspaper

All sections of the newspaper can be recycled
Only clean and dry newspapers
